No need to fire up the grill just yet; restaurants in the Farragut/West Knox Chamber offer up some of the best patio spaces in town. Here are four that shouldn't be missed:

Lakeside Tavern: This patio is unlike any in town. Plenty of outdoor tables give lots of guests an opportunity to enjoy their meals right by the water. Fittingly, daily features include fresh, Hawaiian fish dependent on the previous night's catch. Recently, Lakeside offered wood grilled blue marlin with a sauce of wasabi aioli and cilantro. Add a slice of key lime pie, and that's my kind of patio meal!

Stir Fry Cafe: If you find yourself shopping in Turkey Creek and need some fresh air, make your way to the patio of this superb café known for its Thai and Asian specialties. Plus, Stir Fry now offers sushi; try the yellow fin tuna. On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights, enjoy live music in the trendy, smoke-free bar area.

Season's Café: Finally a restaurant patio in Deep West Knoxville! Located in the Renaissance development, this casually sophisticated restaurant is truly a breath of fresh air. Ask to be seated on the beautifully landscaped patio and have a rare bird's eye view of Kingston Pike. The menu offers "New American cuisine with unique twists," such as the Mascarpone chicken breast stuffed with cheese and fig puree. Or try the meatloaf and see if you can figure out its mouthwatering secret ingredients.

Northshore Brasserie: This restaurant has become quite a Northshore gathering place in a fairly short amount of time. Customers quickly took to the concept inspired by European brasseries. The restaurant's casual, intimate atmosphere is continued outdoors on the patio. When you crave a menu unlike any other in town, check out the Brasserie's French-Belgian cuisine serving up traditional fare such as steak frites, escargot and mussels in five different preparations.

Recent cold snaps have suggested otherwise, but oh so soon, patio weather will be here to stay at least for awhile. Why not celebrate with a meal served under the sun?
