Webster's defines being patient as bearing pains or trials calmly or without complaint, or being steadfast despite opposition, difficulty or adversity. The Knoxville Opera is gearing up for two performances of Verdi's opera, "Rigoletto" this weekend - Friday, February 13 and Sunday, February 15, at the Tennessee Theatre.

Rigoletto, which is one of Verdi's most popular and successful operas, and believed to be one of his favorites, is a three act production set in and around Mantua Italy during the 16th century. The story line encompasses murder, infidelity and vengeance, all while the forces of good vs. evil and light vs. dark are interwoven throughout the costumes, set decorations and characters.

The Farragut West Knox Chamber of Commerce members were invited to attend the final dress rehearsal at 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, February 11. Celeste Hart, director of development for Knoxville Opera said, "Wednesday's dress rehearsal will be very interesting for the guests. They will get to see a little of what goes on behind the scenes." "Meeting" the Needs of Your Business

Although we live in a high-tech world, it's surprising to learn that face-to-face meetings are still the most popular form of business communication. Business executives ranked personal meetings above e-mail, paper memos and voice mail when it pertained to keeping staff informed.

Still, many meetings tend to drag on and accomplish very little and most of us in the business world believe that time is a precious commodity that we cannot afford to waste. Here are a few pointers to help you get the most out of your meeting.

Schedule meetings just before lunch so people will act quickly. Send out an agenda before the meeting so that attendees will hopefully have reviewed it and jotted questions or comments. Invite the fewest number of people necessary. Only meet when absolutely necessary.

Another tip which may or may not work for your business is to plan a quiz for the end of the meeting. This will help meeting leaders and participants to be "on the same page" with regard to what was accomplished and what goals need to be met in the future. There are no right or wrong answers to the quiz... rather a general consensus of the minds.
